Foresight was started by Mark Davis, a 49 year old Denver resident, who is also visually impaired due to an attack of multiple sclerosis.

Centennial Airport Lions Take Part in Eyeglass Sorting Event at the Family Sports Center in Englewood on March 30th.

A t Centennial Airport Lions latest eyeglass sorting event at the Family Sports Center on March 30th, a total of 3,133 sorted eyeglasses were delivered to the district sorting center in 12 boxes. We were joined by the Douglas County club who brought many eyeglasses that they have been collecting.

The detail of the delivered eyeglasses:

- * 1,834 clear prescription eyeglasses
- * 246 prescription sunglasses
- * 317 non-prescription sunglasses
- * 90 specialty eyeglasses
- * 646 broken eyeglasses

* There were several partial boxes of all types of eyeglasses which added up to a couple hundred more eyeglasses sorted.
